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Literacy Activity Compound Word Practice

Snowman is a compound word that is made-up of the words "snow" and "man." This activity will allow children to make their own snow words.

1. Print out the picture of snow. [Click on the image to open a PDF.](#)
2. Have your child find objects around the house that they would like to use to make snow words.
3. Have them lay the object next to the picture and practice combining the words.

Example: Box – if laid next to the picture of snow, both words would create the word snowbox.

Math Activity Snowman Button Math

What you will need:

- dice
- 10 buttons

1. Have your child roll the dice and count the number of dots on them.
2. Have them count out the corresponding number of buttons.



This is a very simple way to teach counting and number awareness.

Science Activity STEM Snowman Trap

In the read-aloud, the author discusses how to catch a snowman. This is a great opportunity to allow your child to think about how they could catch one.

- Using objects around your house, allow your child to make their very own snowman trap.
- Talk to them about how their trap works and the different ways they could catch a snowman.
