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Literacy Activity Rhyming Word Practice

Re-watch the read aloud of *Llama Llama Gram and Grandpa*. Talk about rhyming words with your child. Tell them that rhyming words are words that sound the same.

For example, cat and hat.

When re-watching the video, have your child tell you to pause the video when they hear rhyming words. Talk about those words together.

Can they think of more words that rhyme?

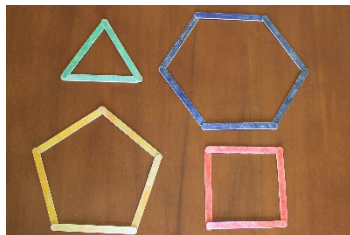
Dramatic Play or Music Activity "I Dropped My Friend"

Math Activity Popsicle Stick Shapes

1. Give your child a large amount popsicle sticks.

3. Talk about the different shapes made and how many sides they have. For example, how is each shape different from another?

- Do not tell your child what you have put into the box.
- Allow your child to hold the box and use their senses to figure out what is inside.
- Do not let them open the box.
