## Math Activity

### Egg Math

This is an activity to work on number recognition while improving fine motor skills.

Put plastic eggs in a bin. Using different size tongs that you have around the house, have your child practice grabbing eggs with the tongs and placing them in the egg carton. rocks, bells & beads. When your child has mastered the tongs, try using clothespins for the same activity.

## Science Activity

### Egg experiment

You will need:  
1 egg  
1 glass or jar of white vinegar

The enamel (the outside layer of your teeth) is made up of the same minerals as the shell on an egg. I am going to use white vinegar because it contains acid. Take your egg and put it into a container of white vinegar, cover it and put it in the refrigerator. Make sure that your egg is submerged in the vinegar. In 24 hours rinse your egg and find out what has changed. Put it back in fresh vinegar and leave it in the refrigerator for 5-6 days. What happened to your egg?

### More activities from First the Egg (continued from Page 1)

Pick a picture each day and go a hunt to find other things that begin with that letter. Daily, have your child pick an animal to draw and tell you what the animal is doing in their picture. Write their response on the page. Writing their response is important because you are modeling how to write.

### Song Lyrics

#### Have You Ever Seen a Penguin Come for Tea?

(chorus)

*Have you ever seen a penguin come to tea?  
Take a look at me a penguin you will see.  
Penguins attention. (arms to sides)  
Penguin salute. (hand straight on forehead)  
Right flipper. (pat right arm into leg with chorus)*

(Repeat chorus, each time adding a new body part)  
Right flipper, left flipper. (pat left arm into leg with chorus)  
Right flipper, left flipper, right leg. (kick leg out to the side)  
Right flipper, left flipper, right leg, left leg. (kick leg out to side)  
Right flipper, left flipper, right leg, left leg, circle.  
(all previous moves while moving in a circular motion)
